What does safeguarding mean?

*protecting children from maltreatment

*protecting their health and development

*ensuring they grow up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care

*to enable children to have optimum life chances and enter adulthood successfully

How does Maybury Primary ensure my child is safe?

It is the school's responsibility to ensure your child is safe and this is achieved in the following ways:

Physical safety

Having one entranceway to the school building for visitors and ensuring all visitors sign in and out, and wear red visitors lanyards

Having CCTV cameras at the gate and keypads at entrances

Termly fire drills take place including Lock Down and off site evacuations.

Termly Health and Safety checks carried our by governors, staff and School Councillors.

Risk assessments carried out by teachers prior to any off site visits.

Emotional safety

Having a values-based ethos where everyone is valued and views are treated with respect.

Providing a safe environment that provides opportunities for children to share any concerns with trained adults e.g. through Bubble Time, Circle Times and PSHE (Personal, Social, and Health education) les-

sons.



<u>Staffing</u>

Ensuring all adults that work or volunteer in school are subject to CRB (Criminal Records Bureau) checks prior to joining the school. Ensuring all new staff members attend Safeguarding training and First Aid training Ensuring the school has a trained CPLO (Child Protection Liaison Officer) and Deputy, and that all staff and visitors know who they are.

<u>Curriculum</u>

Ensuring that topics such as road safety, Bikeability, Park Smart, Stranger Danger, e-safety, antibullying are taught in class and during assemblies.
