

World	The Earth together with all of its countries and people.






	Vocabulary you will need to know

	becomes cooler and the leaves fall off the trees.
Winter	The season between autumn and spring. In the winter the weather is usually cold.
Temperature	How hot or cold something is.
Weather	The temperature or conditions outside. For example if it is wet, hot or windy.
Symbol	A number, a letter or a shape that represents a particular thing.
