Early Years Foundation Stage Update

Rainbow Fish

In nursery the children have been learning about The Chinese New Year. The children enjoyed listening to the story of 'The Great Race' and retelling the story with the small world animals. The children have enjoyed exploring noodles and coloured rice. They have had the opportunity to taste noodles, prawn crackers and spring rolls. In the role play area the children have been cooking Chinese food in the house and in the writing area they have been mark making Chinese writing.



In their Family Learning groups, they have been learning about rhyme and listening for words that rhyme. The children really enjoyed playing silly soup and adding just the things that rhyme to the soup.

After Half Term we will be re-introducing the Toy Library on a Wednesday. Please sign up to join and then your child will be able to choose a different toy to take home each week.

Starfish are very much looking forward to their visit to Elm Farm in March and have started to learn all about farm animals, building their vocabulary so they can name the mummy and the baby animals on the farm.

Thank you to the parents who continue to support our Play and Stay sessions on a Monday morning. It is great to see so many of you engaging with your child's learning.



Key Stage 1 Update

Seahorses

In Seahorse class during English lessons we have been looking at stories from other countries. They wrote their own Safari counting books using counting words, adjectives and verbs and then illustrated them to match our writing.

In computing they have been learning how to use Word. They have learnt how to use capital letters and finger spaces on a computer. The children have also learnt how to highlight their text and change the font colour, style and size.



Jellyfish

Jellyfish class completed their Geography topic, 'Sensational Safari' by researching, designing, making and evaluating African mud huts. They had to think carefully about the purpose of the hut and make accordingly. They had to work very carefully with the clay to create the walls for the hut and then choose an appropriate roof for the top of it and wall art for the outside of the building. By the end of the unit, we had a wonderfully unique village of different mud huts.



Key stage 1 also enjoyed making and tasting their own pancakes this week to celebrate pancake day.

Manta Rays

This month, we have been looking at Rocks for our new Science topic. We worked on sorting them by type of rock and have completed experiments to sort their properties. In Computing, we have been making house pictures using the skills we have learnt so far in our lessons. We have worked hard to copy and

paste pictures, order them and move them around a page. We can now insert pictures and change their colours, size and outline. In RE, we have been learning about Judaism and made special biscuits that are made when celebrating. They looked lovely!

Angelfish

This month, Angelfish class have been learning about natural disasters; specifically looking at volcanoes and earthquakes. Over the half term break, the children were asked to make a model volcano and create a fact file to go with their model. The

standard of work was fantastic! I was extremely impressed and the rest of the school have been admiring their fantastic projects which are being displayed in the school corridor.

Well done Angelfish!! Some of the children also used bicarbonate of soda and vinegar to create an eruption from their volcanoes.

Sea Turtles

In Topic we are continuing to study the Tudors, and are looking at the raising of The Mary Rose warship. We would like to encourage families to think about visiting the Portsmouth Historic Dockyard to see the amazing wreck and artefacts for themselves.

In Science we are looking at the impact our Sun has on Earth and how it affects our seasons and day/ night.


Please could we also remind parents our PE days are Monday and Wednesday this term.

Special Leave of Absence

Please be aware that The Education (Pupil Registration) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2013 state that Headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. The Headteacher should determine the number of school days a child can be away from school if leave is granted.

In accordance with the above Regulations, requests for leave of absence are treated sympathetically, but only in exceptional circumstances can they be approved. The policy of the Government to which this school has agreed, states that parents who take their child out of school for five days or more during term time, without the authority of the Headteacher, will <u>each</u> be liable to receive a penalty notice. Penalty Notices will be issued by the Local Authority.

The penalty is £60 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice, rising to £120 if paid after 21 days but within 28 days of receipt of the notice. If the penalty is not paid in full by the end of the 28-day period the Local Authority must prosecute the recipient for failing to ensure regular school attendance under section 444 Education Act 1996.

Please be aware that **each** parent is liable to receive a Penalty Notice for **each** child who incurs unauthorised absences, for example, if there are two parents and one child, each parent will receive one Penalty Notice.

<u>Trust</u>

January's value is **trust** some suggestions to encourage this important value at home are:

- Talk about people we can trust in the community.
- Talk about what trust means: Trust means you are there for me and I am there for you.

Co-operation

February's value is **co-operation**, some suggestions to encourage this important value at home are:

- Complete cooking activities, have a written or pictorial recipe with ingredients and steps presented in order. Assign roles to each child such as measuring the flour, counting the correct number of eggs, pouring the milk, greasing the pan, and stirring. Children have to wait their turn, follow directions, and share responsibility for creating something they can enjoy later.
- Play team board and card games, these foster cooperation and team strategies.

Equality

March's value is **equality,** some suggestions to encourage this important value at home are:

- Talk to your child about accepting the differences between people.
- Encourage and ensure individuals are treated fairly and equally, no matter their race, gender, age, disability, or religion.
- Read 'Jack & Jim' by Kitty Crowther and 'Amazing Grace' by Mary Hoffman.

Responsibility

April's value is **Responsibility**, some suggestions to encourage this important value at home are:

- Discuss the importance of looking after property, taking care of things and looking after environment
- Encourage your children to be responsible for bringing the correct equipment to school (book bags, library books, P.E kits etc.)
- Read 'Dear Greenpeace' by Simon James and 'Dogger' by Shirley Hughes
