# **Reminders for September**

## **Covid Symptoms**

Any children with the following symptoms must not attend school. They should isolate and arrange to have a PCR test, once the test has been confirmed as a negative result children are able to return to school. Whilst isolated they should complete the home learning which has been set.

- a new continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual).
- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back.
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia) this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything or things smell or taste different to normal

#### School uniform and PE kits

Children will continue to come to school wearing their PE kits on their allocated PE days, including trainers. All other days they must wear full school uniform and black leather school shoes.

## **Google Classroom and remote Learning**

We will continue to set home learning for Key Stage 2 children using Google Classroom, the feedback from the children has been really positive regarding Google Classroom. The children from year 1 onwards will also continue to use CGP books for home learning, these will be sent home in September and should be kept in children's bookbags so they have them to utilise both at school and home. It is your child's responsibility to keep these books safe and in the event of a bubble closure, your child will need these books. If you do lose these books, you will need to replace them, which you can do so by ordering via the CGP website <a href="https://www.cgpbooks.co.uk/">https://www.cgpbooks.co.uk/</a>

We will continue to set remote learning, in line with DFE guidance, which is currently for children with confirmed Covid cases and for children quarantining in line with government recommendations. We will <u>not</u> set remote learning for children who take unauthorised holiday or leave or for children who are generally unwell, if they are well enough to complete their home learning at home, they should be in school.

## **Collections and Pick ups**

From September, we will return to our 'normal' school timings. The school day will start at 8:40am and finish at 3:15pm for all children. The Walton Road Gate will open at 8:35am to enable children to enter the school grounds and get to their classroom for a 8:40am start, the gate will close at 8:45am. Please ensure you arrive on time, as every minute of the school day counts! The school day will finish at 3:15pm, the gates will open at 3:10pm and close at 3:20pm. We will continue to operate a one-way system, this system has had very positive feedback and has eased congestion at collection time. All parents/carers should enter via the Walton Road gate, collect their child/ren from their classroom/s and then exit via the Portugal Road gate.

## **Parent/Carers Learning Consultations meetings**

In the Autumn term, Parent/Carers Learning Consultations meetings will continue to take place on the telephone.

#### After school activities

We will return to operating our FREE after school activities from September, these enrichment opportunities allow children to access a range of sporting and creative opportunities outside of the curriculum. More information about signing up for these activities will be sent out in September when the children return to school. Please note, Reception children will not be invited to attend these clubs until January 2022, to enable them to settle into the longer school day and routine in the Autumn term.

## **Birthday celebrations**

The children have really missed bringing in treats to share with their classmates this year to celebrate their birthdays. From September, children are able to bring sweets or pre-cut cakes into school on their birthdays. These <u>must not contain nuts</u> and should be in sealed containers.

# Bags

From September, children will bring their bookbags to school every day, which will be stored in the class cloak-rooms. Children in Reception, Years 1 and 2 must bring a Maybury Primary bookbag and children in Years 3,4,5 and 6 can bring a Maybury Primary bookbag or a small school bag. Due to limited space in the cloakrooms please ensure children in years 3-6 do not bring oversized bags.



## Handwashing and hand sanitiser

We will continue to promote appropriate hand washing routines in to our school day and children will be able to bring a non-alcohol based hand sanitiser into school. This should be in a clear, named container.

# **Key Stage 2 Update**


### **Manta Rays**

# **Attendance—Penalty Notices**

## Penalty Notices to Address Poor Attendance at School

A Penalty Notice may be issued as an alternative to the prosecution of a parent/carer for their child's unauthorised absence from school and will be used by Surrey County Council in the following circumstances:-

- 1. Pupils identified by police and Inclusion Officers engaged on Truancy Patrols and who have incurred unauthorised absences.
- 2. Leave of absence in term time (5 days or 10 sessions or more). Please be aware that The Education (Pupil Registration) (England)(Amendment) Regulations 2013, which became law on 1st September 2013 state that Headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. The Headteacher is also required to determine the number of school days a child can be away from school if leave is granted.

In such cases the Headteacher/Governing Body have to judge whether there are exceptional circumstances and may request that the Local Authority issue Penalty Notices when the absence is not authorised. Warnings will not be given where it can be shown that parents have been notified that such absences will not be authorised.

3. The issue of a Penalty Notice will also be considered where it is judged that a parent is failing to ensure their child's regular school attendance. This will be considered when a pupil has incurred 7 or more unauthorised sessions in the previous 6 school weeks, which may include a pupil arriving late after close of registration.

If you believe at any stage that your child's absence from school may leave you liable to receive a Penalty Notice, it is extremely important that you take action without delay to secure their regular attendance. If you have any questions or require further support to achieve an improvement, please contact the school or the Inclusion Officer.

## **Penalty Notice relating to Exclusions**

If a child is excluded from school, Section 103 of the Education and Inspections Act 2006 places a duty on parents/carers to ensure that their child is not in a public place without justifiable cause during school hours. This duty applies to the first five days of each exclusion. Failure to do so will render the parent/carer liable to a Penalty Notice. (Alternative education provision will be made available from the sixth day of any exclusion.)

### **Amount Payable for a Penalty Notice**

The amount payable for a Penalty Notice issued in any of the above circumstances is £60 if paid within **21** days of receipt of the Notice, rising to £120 if paid after **21** days but within **28** days. If the Penalty Notice is not paid, the recipient will be prosecuted in the Magistrates Court for the offence for which the Notice was originally issued.

Please be aware that <u>each</u> parent is liable to receive a Penalty Notice for <u>each</u> child who incurs unauthorised absences, for example, if there are two parents and one child, each parent will receive one Penalty Notice.

If there are two parents, and two children incur unauthorised absences, each parent will receive two Penalty Notices, which in this case would amount to £120 each if paid within 21 days.
