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# **Starting Nursery**

At Maybury Primary School we understand that starting Nursery is one of the most exciting experiences of your child's life. This handbook has been written to answer some of your questions and to help you to prepare your child for school.

Parents and their child are invited to a stay and play session in Nursery during the Summer Term before their child starts in Nursery. This provides parents with an opportunity to meet the teachers, visit their child's new classroom and discuss arrangements for September.

In our Nursery we provide a happy, safe and stimulating environment for your child that extends his/her skills, knowledge and self confidence. A variety of activities are planned around the children's interests. These help the children develop not only educationally but also socially and emotionally. Moreover, children are encouraged to discover and explore a variety of activities, both inside and outside. We make extensive use of our outdoor area to extend children's learning opportunities as well as offering space for more physical activities.

We follow the school's discipline policy and reward good behaviour, kindness, helpfulness, politeness and effort with praise, reflecting our values-based ethos.

By the end of Nursery, children should have acquired good basic skills across the curriculum and be confident, enthusiastic and independent learners, ready for school.

Our aim is to work in partnership with parents to give each child the best possible start on their learning journey.

## **Home Visits**

We find that home visits are an excellent opportunity for getting to know you and your child better and for giving you the opportunity to discuss any concerns, queries etc. before your child starts Nursery. We will offer you a home visit time at the end of July. You time will be allocated during the stay and play session.

## **Settling into Nursery**

We would like to ensure that your child settles into our Nursery quickly. To make the settling-in process easier, we would ask parents to stay with their child on their first day in the Nursery for a short visit.

Every child will react differently to the Nursery; some might settle very quickly, while others might need a bit longer. Our first concern is the child and with your support we would like to make sure that your child has all the time they need to settle happily into our nursery.

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## **Early Years**

## **Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum**

Children joining the Nursery and Reception follow the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) curriculum which is organised into 7 areas of learning and development:

The three prime areas are:

**Communication and Language** development involves giving children opportunities to experience a rich language environment; to develop their confidence and skills in expressing themselves and to speak and listen in a range of situations.

**Physical Development** involves providing opportunities for our children to be active and interactive and to develop their co-ordination, control, manipulation and movement. Children learn about the importance of physical activity and to make healthy choices regarding nutrition.

**Personal, Social and Emotional Development** encourages children to work and play co-operatively with others and function in a group beyond the family. It covers important aspects of personal, social, moral and spiritual development, including the development of personal values and an understanding of self and of others.

The four specific areas are:

**Literacy** development encourages children to link sounds and letters and begin to read and write. Children have access to a wide range of books, poems and other written materials to foster a love of reading.

**Mathematics** involves children learning through practical activity to develop their skills in counting, understanding and using numbers, calculating addition and subtraction problems and describing shapes, spaces and measures.

**Understanding of the World** encourages children to learn about the environment, other people, technology and features of the natural world. This provides a foundation for later work in science, history, geography and information technology.

**Expressive Arts and Design** shows children how to explore and play with a wide range of media and materials as well as providing opportunities for sharing their thoughts, ideas and feelings through a variety of activities in art, music, movement, dance and role-play and design and technology.

We plan our learning on the Children's interests whilst ensuring coverage of the (EYFS) curriculum.





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## **Daily routines**

We would like your child to become independent and self reliant from day one so we would therefore, ask you to encourage your child to...

Put their name on the registration board Hang up their own coat and book bag Select an activity of their choice

### Illness

If your child is ill please telephone the school in the morning to tell us that he/she will be absent. Please phone the school office on 01483 763272 every day of your child's absence.

## **Nursery hours**

Nursery children will attend one of the following sessions:

#### Monday to Friday:

Morning session 8.30am—11.30am

Afternoon session 12.15pm—3.15pm

Full Time 8.30am - 3.15pm

## Lunchtime for Children staying a whole day

The children are supervised throughout the lunch break by our Nursery staff, who provide the children with learning opportunities at lunchtime.

Parents are able to pay for a cooked school dinner at the cost of £2.45 per day or bring a packed lunch to school in a suitable container. Lunchbox contents should be in line with our Healthy Schools Lunchtime Policy (available on our website) so that we can all work together to achieve our Healthy School Aims.

Sandwiches should include a healthy filling (egg, salad, tuna, cheese, cucumber etc.)

Chocolate spread, jam and honey are not considered healthy fillings as they have a high sugar content so please do not use these as sandwich fillings for school. Also we can no longer include Peanut butter and Nutella as a sandwich filling due to their nut content, which could seriously affect any child or adult with a nut allergy.

Alternatives to bread are welcome, pitta breads, flat breads, wraps, crackers or why not try a pasta salad with tomato and peppers. We welcome any ideas on a healthy lunch you would like to share with us.



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## **Collecting Children**

Children must be brought to school and collected by an adult. If someone other than yourself is due to pick up your child you must let us know. This avoids confusion, or your child becoming distressed. If you know that you are going to be late picking up your child please let us know.

#### **Breakfast Club**

Our breakfast club starts at 8.00m and is £2.50 per day. It is available on an ad hoc basis, with no need for booking. The children are provided with Cereals, toast and juice.

If you are interested in your child attending, please see the school office for more information and to book a place for your child.

## **Home School Agreement**

This agreement is in the form of a partnership and will be signed by the school and the parent on entry to the Nursery.



On cold days children will always need coats, hats and gloves as they will still play and learn outside.

Please label all items of clothing with your child's name.

Jewellery, earrings and nail varnish must NOT be worn in school





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### **Refreshments in class**

As part of our healthy eating ethos, the school will be offering the children fresh fruit or raw vegetables on a daily basis.

The school also participates in the "Cool Milk" scheme, whereby all under 5's receive free milk daily.

### **Health and Welfare**

If your child has measles, chickenpox, mumps or any other infectious illness, please let the school know as soon as possible.

If your child has any allergies please let us know, or, if you have any concerns about your child's health, please come and talk to us. The more we understand your child, the more we can help them at school.

The children are taught basic health education, caring for teeth, washing hands after going to the toilet and before eating food, looking after our bodies, growing and healthy eating.

#### Illness or accident at School

Your child's safety is one of our major concerns and we try to provide a safe learning environment inside and outside the classroom with continual adult supervision. In case of illness or accident at school it is sometimes necessary to contact a parent immediately. We ask parents, therefore, to fill in a form giving us a series of telephone numbers to call in case of emergencies. If these should change subsequently, please let us know as soon as possible.

### **Bedtime**

School is tiring for most children so please encourage early bedtimes. A tired child will not get the most out of school. Please note that children aged 3-4 years need at least 12 hours of sleep every night.

#### Hair

It is very important that parents inspect their child's head regularly to check for head lice. If head lice are found, please let the school know, so that other parents check their child's head. It is important that hair is treated immediately.



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## **Birthdays**

If you would like to bring cakes/sweets or a healthy alternative to school on your child's birthday, you can do so but please check with the teacher first. Please make sure that food that is bought into the school is nut-free.

## **Managing Behavior**

Maybury is a values-based School where staff and children treat each other with respect. We value honesty and believe that only in an atmosphere of warmth and trust children thrive and learn. We do not condone violence of any kind, be it bullying or fighting. The best way to deal with problems, should they arise, is to talk about them. We encourage children to come and talk to us if anything is bothering them. We rely on the support of parents to enable us to do this. If you feel there is a problem, please come and talk to us. (Please see the Behaviour Policy in the School Office for additional information)

#### **Parental Involvement**

Parents are welcome to help out in school, once a Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check has been competed. In order to avoid confusing your child, we would ask you to help out in another class.

Parent workshops are also held regularly. (For further information, please contact our Home/School Liaison officer, Mrs M Hussain).

In the Early Years, teachers and parents usually meet on a daily basis which gives us the opportunity to discuss children's progress regularly. However, if you do not bring and collect your child from school we are always happy to arrange an appointment for you to come and see us after school. We feel it is important that you are kept informed about your child's achievements and overall development throughout the year.

You will receive one meeting with your child's keyworker either in the autumn or spring term and a report of your child's progress when they leave Nursery in the summer term.

## **Your child's Learning Journey**

Throughout your child's time in Nursery we will record your child's progress of learning on an online platform called Tapestry. These important steps will be shared with you via the Tapestry platform.
