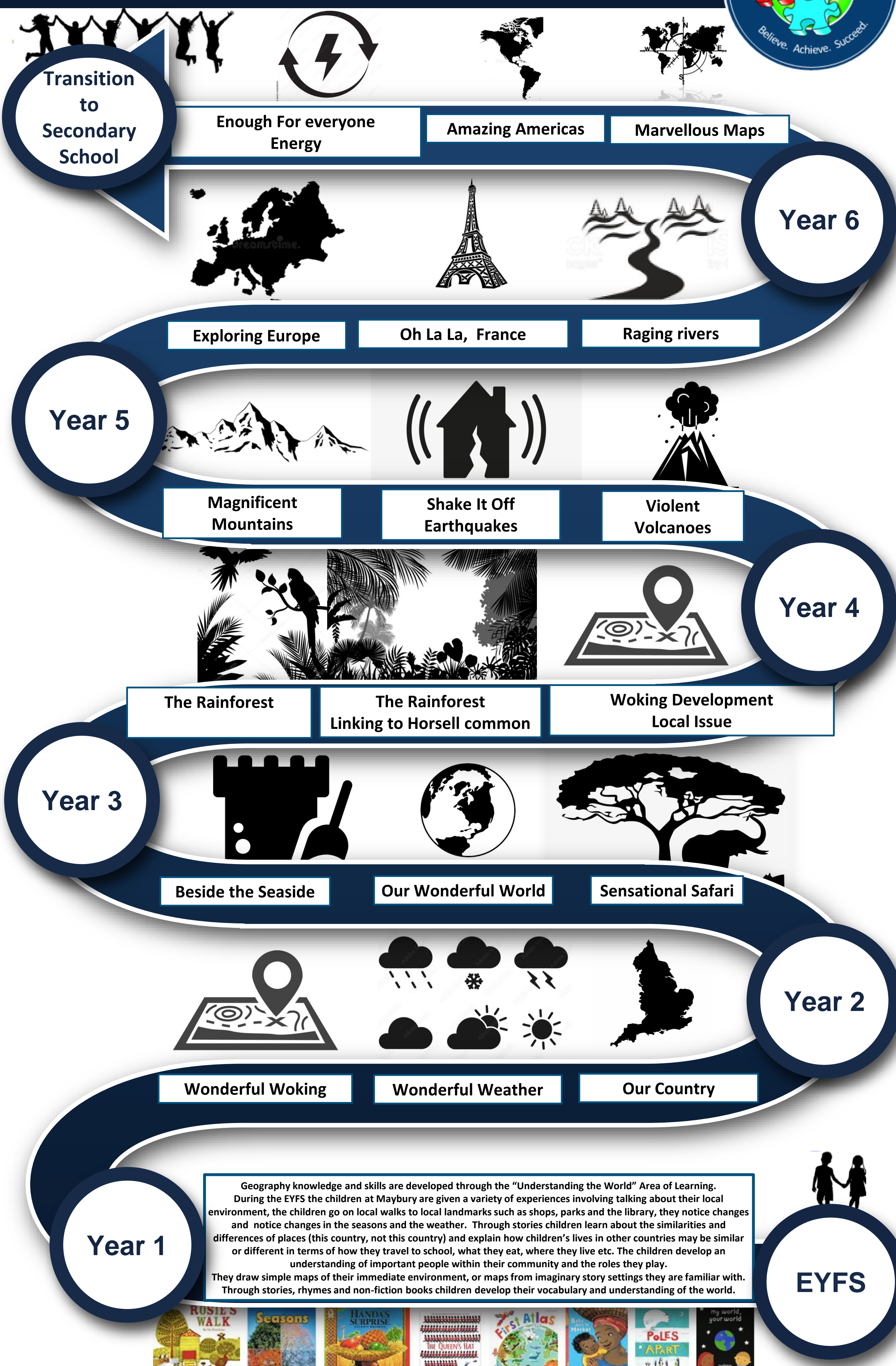

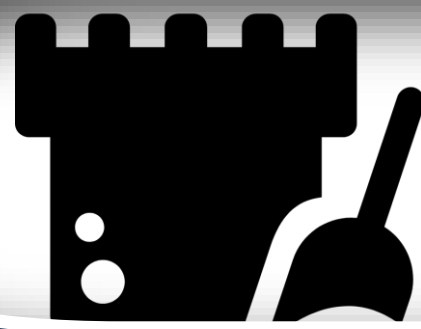

Geography knowledge and skills are developed through the "Understanding the World" Area of Learning. During the EYFS the children at Maybury are given a variety of experiences involving talking about their local environment, the children go on local walks to local landmarks such as shops, parks and the library, they notice changes and notice changes in the seasons and the weather. Through stories children learn about the similarities and differences of places (this country, not this country) and explain how children's lives in other countries may be similar or different in terms of how they travel to school, what they eat, where they live etc. The children develop an understanding of important people within their community and the roles they play. They draw simple maps of their immediate environment, or maps from imaginary story settings they are familiar with. Through stories, rhymes and non-fiction books children develop their vocabulary and understanding of the world.
