The government has introduced updated Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE) guidance, which schools are required to follow from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2026.

As a result, we are reviewing our RSHE curriculum and policy to ensure that our provision remains appropriate for our pupils, taking into account their:

- Age and stage of development
- Physical and emotional maturity
- Religious and cultural background
- Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND)

We would value your feedback as part of this review.

The curriculum documents available on the website are the complete lessons that will be taught by class teachers, allowing you to see exactly what pupils will learn at each stage. Relationships Education and Health Education are compulsory in primary schools. Parents retain the right to withdraw their child from any sex education taught beyond the National Curriculum for Science. Please see Section 14 of the RSHE Policy for further information about the withdrawal process.
